

Criteria for Patrick Nesbit Perpetual Trophy

To be awarded to the Patrick Nesbit Perpetual Trophy for the Best Woodside Cricket Club Junior Cricketer playing Senior Grade Cricket throughout the season determination of the Best Junior is based on 2 criteria, Points and Grade Weighting.

Points:

Points are awarded in line with the Woodside Cricket Club Cricketer of the Year award on the following basis;

- Run - 1 point for every run scored
- Wicket - 10 points for every wicket taken
- Catch - 10 points for every catch effected
- Stumping - 10 points for every stumping effected
- Run out (individual) - 10 points for every run out effected
- Run out (shared) - 5 points for every runout effected where 2 or more parties are involved

Grade Weighting:

Due to the various different competition formats and the standard of competition between the various grades a Grade Weighting system is employed. The Grade Weighting is as follows;

- D Grade or lowest senior grade = 1.0
- C Grade = 1.2
- B Grade = 1.5
- A2 Grade = 1.8
- A Grade = 2.0

Example

Points	260	100
Grade Weighting	1.0	1.4
Weighting Points	260	140
Total Season Points	400	

To be eligible for this award the Junior Cricketer must;

- Play a minimum of 3 games of senior cricket for The Woodside Cricket Club during that premiership season.
- Must be a financial member of the Woodside Cricket Club, (Junior membership) during that premiership season.
- Player must under 16 as per the association cut off date, ie under 16 permit players are not eligible.
