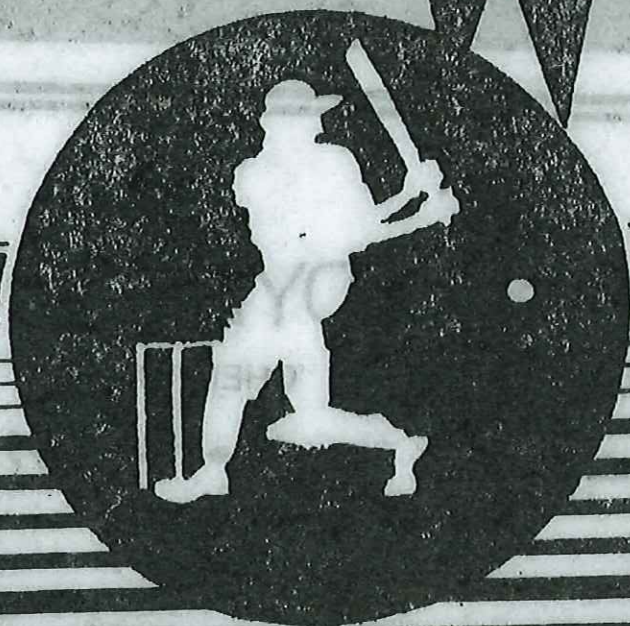

## "A" PLAYER PROFILE

### 1. GRAHAM GREEN

Elected Vice-Captain at the start of the season and he performed this duty excellently by giving me 100% support. His bowling this year was once again of the highest standard and this earned him association selection. His batting did not reach the heights of the previous season but he did produce a couple of excellent innings. We are unfortunately going to lose him for next season but in the short time he has been with us he has given the Club excellent service.

### 2. PAT NESBIT

Pat started the season in excellent fashion and with Bob McEvoy provided us with some excellent opening Partnerships. He missed a couple of games due to his Cherries and unfortunately did not regain his early season form. We did not see Pat's high standard of fielding because the skipper had to field Pat in the slips for most of the day.

### 3. BILL OLIVER

Bill once again started the season slowly but once his golf game got going so did Bill. He once again won the association bowling trophy and naturally for the second year in a row the club's bowling trophy. His batting was once again of good value and in numerous games he was involved in excellent partnerships. He was also one of the few people to regularly hold his catches in the slip.

### GRAHAM MEDLOW

Graham as "A" Grade Captain led the side on and off the field superlatively. One of the most respected Captains in the Association.

## SUMMARY (2)

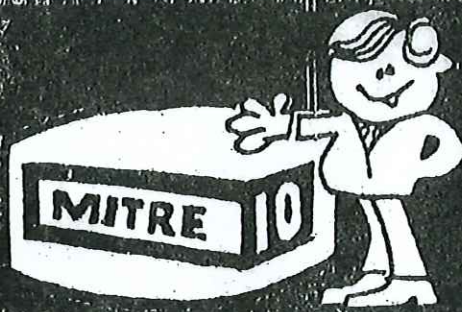
The good things for the season were as follows: -

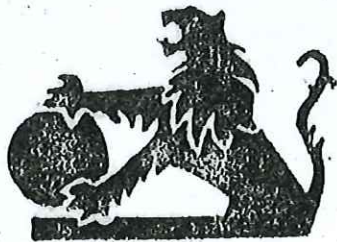

At the start of last season when I took over the captaincy of the side I thought it would probably be about 3 years before we would make the four. We had a lot of young players with heaps of raw talent. Getting that talent channelled in the right direction usually takes more than one season in a cricket side. Last season we just missed the four, but did play in the Graeber Cup One Day final, which we lost.

This season we started with 4 new players in the side, one playing his first season of cricket. We received a forfeit in the first match, a one day game. While it was nice to receive the points for the match, not playing put us behind the other sides in match practice, which was going to take us several weeks to recover from. Having new players in the side as well and not being able to see them under match conditions was also of concern. Slotting them into the positions where they were going to be of most benefit to the side took a little longer than anticipated.

We started the season very badly, losing four matches straight. We were in a position to win three of those matches but did not apply ourselves with the bat. At this stage we just couldn't get an opening partnership together, which was placing added pressure on all other batsmen.

Chris Nesbit was brought up from the C Grade for one game. Mind you he batted at number 11 in the first innings. During that innings I think he finished 0 not out. I noticed a raw talent that could be applied in an opening position. In that match we batted a second time and experimented with Dave Jenkins and Chris Nesbit opening. The move brought immediate success and was to be a successful opening combination for the rest of the minor round.

The turning point came in the match before Christmas when we were able to beat Barossa Districts. We never lost another Saturday competition match for the season.

The match which changed the approach from the side was the second match after Christmas when we played Lobethal. Chasing 168 runs on the second day of the match we slumped to be 7 for 62. Two fighting partnerships where two of the youngest lads in the side really come of age saw us get up and win. From that game on Darren Faust never failed to score with the bat and in fact went from strength to strength and carried that form through the finals.

From that game I saw a big change in attitude towards batting by most lads in the side. As a result confidence grew and towards the end of the season, if you listened to the conversations, you wouldn't think we could be beaten.



Having made the four all the hard work had been done. In finals two factors usually decide who wins. Usually the side that applies themselves with the bat, and the side that overcomes the pressure associated with finals first.

Having been associated with a number of sides in finals you usually expect a couple of fellows to excell with individual efforts. This is the first team I have been associated with where the success of winning a Premiership can only be attributed to an outstanding team effort. In fact the semi-final win against Palmer was a classic example of us playing as a complete team and then as individuals.

We struggled early with the bat but once again a complete team effort saw us reach 154 runs. This was enough to keep Lobethal under pressure.

I would like to thank all the members of the side for their efforts and support during the season. I have been fortunate enough to be associated with such a tremendous bunch of fellows and am very pleased that their efforts in performing as a team have been rewarded.

## PLAYER PROFILE

CHRIS NESBIT - Right hand opening batsmen. Right hand into the wind bowler. Chris's efforts in the opening position is one of the reasons we made the four. Chris has a tremendous eye, but needs to do some work on his technique. Doesn't quite get his feet close enough to the line of the ball yet. Struggled a little against swing bowling for that reason. Could also develop into an opening bowler, moving the ball both ways. Needs to do some work on his run up (what run up?) and action. Fielding improved greatly during the season. Potential to be a top cricketer for the Club if prepared to put in a little work.



**DAVE MURRELL** - Left hand opening bat. Right hand very ordinary bowler. Would make a good outfielder as long as somebody else threw the ball back. The only player in the side I wouldn't be game to stand behind when he is throwing the ball. Being a left hand batsman, I have been tempted to ask Dave whether he has tried throwing with his left arm. Opened the batting in the finals with a lot of success until he ran himself out in the Grand Final. Enthusiastic cricketer and on field computer.

**SHANE GALE** - Right hand batsman. Very good fieldmen, but used this season as a wicket keeper. Sometimes had trouble picking Jenko's big inswinger down the leg side, but did a fine job for the side behind the stumps. Shane also batted at number 3 during the year. After being struck in the face early in the season, lacked a bit of confidence. Perhaps should consider wearing a helmet. Also needs to work on his technique. Must practice moving the front foot towards the pitch of the ball. Also gets too square on when playing back, one of the reasons he got hit. A very valuable team member doing a great job for the side. Shane showed a lot of confidence in the side after we lost four games in a row - booked himself in for a knee operation just before the finals.

**MILTON PROSSER** - VICE CAPTAIN of the side and one of the experienced cricketers in the team. Right hand middle order batsman and right hand medium pace bowler. Very reliable with both bat and ball. The only player in the side with a shot of his own called the "Prosser Special". A sweep shot off medium pace bowling, taken anywhere from leg stump to outside off stump. Brings Milton a lot of runs, but also gets him out occasionally. Milton had a good season with both bat and ball.

**MICHAEL AUBERT** - Often known by other names. Right hand batsman and ordinary right hand bowler. A little slow in the field but I am sure would be a great asset if we could find the right place for him. A very promising young batsman - played several "A" grade games during the season. Needs to concentrate a little harder, particularly after getting to 20-30 runs. Must prevent himself hooking short balls outside the off stump early in his innings. A more consistent year from Michael and a very valuable member of the side.

**DARREN FAUST** - Right arm opening bowler and right hand batsman. The only player to eat pasties before, during and after the game. This was Darren's first year of cricket; previously having devoted all his talents to tennis. Apparently one of the prime movers in having mixed doubles played in junior tennis. Also well known around the netball courts in certain areas.

**GLENN COOPER** - Good fielder and batsman. The season in 82, he was very good. Batted at number 3 and 4. Very good. Also played in the 1st XI. A very valuable member of the side. A cricketer with a lot of experience.



**DARREN FAUST** cont. - The youngest member of the side possessing loads of natural ability in all aspects of the game. Had a great year with the ball and learnt more about batting in one season than some players in 10. Struggled with the bat early in the season and finished as our most reliable batsmen. Took some of the best outfield catches I have ever seen. One of the real characters of the side with the potential to become one of the best cricketers in the Association.

**IAN MOSKING** - Right arm spin bowler and right hand middle order batsmen. The number one spinner in the side this season. Was responsible for the side winning several games with some very intelligent bowling. Has the ability to make a lot more runs with the bat. Tends to play across the line of the ball too early in his innings. Reliable in the field as long as the ball is hit along the ground. A very good team member and a pleasure to play with.

**KYM HOLLITT** - Right hand punishing batsmen and right arm off spin bowler. Kym also possesses one of the best throwing arms in the Club. His catching also improved 100% on last season. Kym has the ability to make a lot of runs but usually lets himself down through lack of concentration after he has done the hard work and got a start. Has been known to run several players out during the season. Kym calls that loudly when he is batting that by the time he hears the call of "NO" from the other batsman he is down the other end shaking hands with him. Also bowled very well when called upon to do so. Now starting to perform at a more consistent level.

**STEVEN DOWNS** - Right hand batsman and right arm off spin bowler who can also bowl medium pace. Unable to practice with the side due to work commitments. Usually reliable in the field unless ball comes along the ground. Former specialist gully fieldman. This season needed a ball to have a rattle in it to wake him up. Batting needs some work in the nets. A valuable member of the side who took a great catch in the semi-final. Filled in as wicket keeper with dubious distinction when Shane had his knee done.

**COLIN MANGLES DORF** - Right arm swing bowler and right hand batsman. Specialist cover fieldman for the side and also good outfielder. Specialist number 11 batsman this season, which showed great improvement during the year. This was Mango's second season of cricket, after having played tennis. Much improved in the semi-final. A great Clubman who I expect to take a lot of wickets next season.

**GLEN COOPER** - Coops fitted into the side like a glove. Played most of the season in the 'A' Grade, but kept superbly in the 2 finals. Batted at number 4 in the finals. Likes fishing outside the off stump with poor returns. Coops also added a little more experience to the side which was invaluable in the finals.
