#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The junior section of the club continued to go from strength to strength. Under coaches Duane Ireland, Ricky Hill and Peter Johns all three grades continued to improve their performance and all gave their best for the club. The under 15's finished the season on top of the southern section but unfortunately were beaten by one wicket in the semi-final. The under 12's finished the season on a top note being unbeaten in the last 7 games. They were only beaten twice during the season. The under 10's playing modified rules have had a very successful season with a large number of players turning out each season.

From a chairman's point of view I was disappointed at times with the efforts of a number of our younger players in the lower grades. Their commitment to training and matches were no where near what is required if they are going to play competitive sport. I hope that they soon realikse to get satisfaction from sport a bigger effort is required on their behalf.

In conclusion I would like to thank Pat Nesbit as secretary and Bill Gale as treasurer. Also to the rest of the committee, coaches and captains I say thanks for all your efforts. #### Graham Medlow Captain

#### 'B' GRADE REPORT

By our standards we had a very poor season. With the players we had we proved to be competitive, just lacking the depth in the side of the previous season. Losing both opening bowlers and batsmen from last season takes some replacing.

During the season we used over 30 players and never played two matches in a row with the same side. Very unsettled.

#### Dave Hurrelli

Left hand opening bat. Unorthodox in his technique but usually gave us a sound start. Regularly got to 20-30 runs and then got himself out. Needs some work on leg side shots as the leg stump quite often hit the ground. Would have liked to bat Dave down the list but never had the opening batsmen to allow us that luxury. Also quite a useful wicket-keeper. Has been known to run 1 or 2 batsmen out.

#### Shane Gale

Reluctant right hand opening batsman - wicket-keeper. Not a forceful bat, more of a deflector. Has the ability to concentrate for long periods of time which is essential when opening an innings. Still does not believe enough in his own ability as a batsman. Shane opened the innings mainly in the second half of the season and rarely failed. Also our main wicket-keeper during the season performing consistently with the gloves. Outfield returns had to be over the stumps as Shane wore shorts and no pads. Regularly tired to break the batsmen's concentration by telling lengthly jokes (2-3 overs usually) but only succeeded in upsetting the concentration of the slips field. Should take on the captaincy of the side next season.

#### Joel Lewis

Right hand batsman and right arm medium pace bowler. Joel had an excellent start to the season with the bat. Then played several A grade games and never really recaptured that early forms, although putting in some useful knocks for the side. Has the ability to bat anywhere in the side and made a lot of runs. Just requires a little more concentration which will come with experience. Joel also put in some very good performances with the ball. Fell into the trap of bowling too short on occasions. Would like to see him lengthen his balanced properly at the deliver stride. Because of his height and upright action would like to see him come off a longer run and bowl faster. May then get away with the odd short one.

#### Milton Prosser (Vice Captain)

Right hand batsman and medium pace bowler. Once again Milton was one of our more consistent performers both with the bat and ball. Probably a little disappointed with his batting in the second half of the season. Does not get as many wickets as he deserves when bowling. Consistently beats the bat without getting the edge.

#### Steven Downs

Right hand batsman and right arm off spin or leg spin bowler. Wish he would not try and bowl both in one over. Has the ability to make a lot of runs. Usually suffers from a lapse of concentration too early lacks innings. Made runs towards the end of the season. Bowling lacks a little consistency in direction a result of not being able to practice often enough. Steven has a very good arm in the outfield and also the ability to make a good wick-keeper. Steven has indicated he will be playing tennis next season. We thank him for the past couple of seasons and wish him well with his tennis but hope to see him back playing cricket in the not too distant future.

#### Robin Goode

Right hand batsman and right arm off spin bowler. Unfortunately, Robin joined us lated in the season. If he had played the full season I am sure he would have taken a lot of wickets and also made useful socres with the bat. His experience would have been invaluable over a full season.

#### Kym Hollitt

Right hand batsman and right arm off spin bowler. Kym has the ability to be a very punishing batsman. If only he could contain his aggression for the first five or six overs he would make a lot of runs. Also the ability to be good off spin bowler. Lacks a little concentration at times, however, put in some very good performances with the ball. Tremendous arm in the outfield.

#### Ronnie Nauman

Right hand batsman and right arm medium pace bowler. Ronnie has the ability to be a good all round cricketer. Bowling needs a lot of practice to bowl a consistent line on off stump. Ability to bat also, at this stage not moving his feet is the main cause of his dismissals. Regular practice would overcome this.

#### Colin Mangelsdorf

Right arm medium pace bowler and professional number 11 batsman. Mango was our leading wicket taker during the season. Still lacks a little consistency on line and length. Ability to move the ball both ways. Would like to see him lengthen his run up and bowl a little faster. Would be very difficult to play with a little more pace.

#### Michael Aubert

Right hand batsman. Michael can bat anywhere in the top half of the order. Has the ability to make a lot of runs, but still lacks the concentration necessary to made a big score. Suffered this season through not playing in the side regularly.

#### Darren Bloomfield

Right hand batsman. Right arm bowler. Darren has the ability to be good medium pace bowler with a little more work. Usually tires to hit too many balls over the fenced when batting. A little more experience and will be a useful all rounder. Very good in the field and a valuable member of the side.

I would like to thank all those players who played for the B grade during the season. It has been a pleasure playing with you.

#### UNDER 15's COACHES REPORT

At the beginning of the 1984-85 cricket season when I accepted the position as coach of the Under 15's I looked upon it as a great challenge, having never coached any side before. The team generally had a good year (losing just the one game before the finals), with all players chipping in at sometime or another with worthwhile contributions.

We had five players score more than 90 runs for the season and seven bowlers who captured six or more wickets. With this in mind we can see there was no one 'star' in the Under 15's this year, with every players contribution being highly valued.

The highlights of the season, from the teams point of view would have to be, the winning of the game against Gumeracha by just 5 runs, and fighting back in the semi final. We batted first to set Mt Pleasant 114 runs to win (D. Newman 36, N. Stokes 25). After making a good start and being 5 for 110, we then claimed 3 wickets for 1 run. This put us in with an outside chance, but we were finally beaten in the second to last over of the day.

#### UNDER 15's PLAYERS PROFILES

DALE NEWMAN - As captain of the Under 15's Dale has a mature approach to his cricket and is equally talented with both bat and ball. It was a good year for Dale making four scores over 35, but never being able to reach that elusive 50. Dale had an equally good year with the ball, but quite often found he was moving the ball too much to find the batsmens edge.

STEVEN HAHESY - Steven's technique as a batsmen is very correct and well suited to openning the batting. As well as batting very well Steven showed good alround qualities, being our second highest wicket taker and giving a very good display in the field with good ground work and a couple of great slips catches.

TIM JOHNS - At the beginning of the year I was told Tim was a Medium pacer who could also bowl a bit of Leg Spin. With the knowledge our team had an abundance of Medium pace bowlers, I asked Tim to concentrate mainly on his spin. In one game over the two innings Tim took 8 wickets for 3 runs from 5 very tidy overs. Tim also made the most of his limited opportunities with the bat scoring 71 runs, with a highest score of 36 and losing his wicket only once.

DARYL LANGBEIN - Daryl is a batsmens who tends to rely on his good eye rather than move his feet into good positioning.
