PRESIDENTS REPORT

PROFILE OF 'A' GRADE PLAYERS

1. BILL OLIVER

Bill has just completed his 5th season with the Club. He got his "just reward" this season with the Club winning its first 'A' Grade Premiership. He has again this season won the Club's bowling trophy and, although his batting was not up to the usual standard, he made a very valuable 20 in our semi-final win against Mt. Torrens.

2. GREG PARKER

Greg has been a valuable member of the Club since he joined us just before Christmas. It was a Christmas present a lot of people would not need - but actually we were quite happy to take the nomad. His batting has been very solid - a real rival for Undys - his bowling useful, and his field, when in the right place, very handy. His use of the voice in the field very good, not so good when he is batting.

3. PAT NESBIT

When, at the start of the season, Pat wanted to play 'B' Grade, the 'As' looked like they were going to lose a very valuable player. Thank God he decided to make the transition again and became a very good player in our Premiership win. His effort in the Grand Final was outstanding - firstly in his opening partnership with Undys, sorry Greg Parker, and then a superb effort in the field under extreme difficulties. A wonderful team member and I am glad he was a member of our first ever 'A' Grade Premiership team.

4. ADRIAN BAKER

The most dedicated, determined and hard working member of the team. His lack of talent makes him work hard to get success. Actually, he is one of the most talented cricketers I have seen. His batting in the finals was absolutely brilliant, his bowling excellent, and his fielding great. I hope that when he goes back to Perth he tries to play the highest level of cricket he can - he might be surprised what that may be.

5. BRIAN BUTCHER

"Mr. Spare parts" - he carries a complete set of everything if we needed anything from a bottle opener to a broom - it was always in Butch's boot. His comeback to cricket was probably one of our greatest recruits for the season - good to see the young players coming good!! His bowling was always accurate and proved a point to a particular person. He hit the winning runs in the semi-final, and then bowled 19 overs, on the trot, in the Grand Final and was of immense value.

FIRST A-GRADE CHAMPIONSHIP FOR WOODSIDE

Woodside has won its first-ever Torrens Valley A-grade cricket premiership in the 50-year history of the championship.

Re-formed prior to the 1980 cricket season after a decade without a club, Woodside convincingly won the Torrens Valley final at Mt Pleasant on Sunday afternoon.

Graham Medlow skipped Woodside to a sizable 62-run victory against reigning premier, Cambrai.

Woodside's earlier successes include B-grade premiership in 1945-6 season and a victory in 1983-4.

By winning the toss, Medlow struck the opening blow. In selecting to bat, he placed firm pressure upon openers Greg Parker (30) and Pat Nesbitt (15) to get the club away to a solid start. Two wickets fell in the 30s and Cambrai appeared to have regained normal composure. But the batting of Adrian Baker (55) and later Medlow (63) had the Cambrai attack struggling ... and at 4 for 170, the premiership holder knew it was involved in a tough match.

Runs continued to the end of the 57 overs of the day's cricket ... Woodside finishing with 233 for the loss of seven wickets.

This is the highest grand final score since Paracombe set Lobethal 240 four seasons ago. It represented almost seven runs every two overs.

The Cambrai attack worked nautically but on this day was cooled. Neil Schutz (2 for 67), Mike Penney (2 for 59) and Mark Callin (2 for 56) claimed most wickets from a combined total of 50 overs.

While Saturday's cricket was played in warm weather, the second afternoon had a threat of rain in the skies. The heavy clouds did of produce the best light for batting.

The Cambrai start was bad. opener Steve Jones was caught if his glove and association batsman Mark Callins had his stumps ended ... neither scored. Brenton 'Barney' Wright and avid Underwood struggled for several overs to gain a balance. Each might have been run out several times had they not hit the net. Survive they did and at 2 for 51 Cambrai had quietened the tack and were on-line for this big task.

A smart catch by 'keeper Wayne Ireland ended Wright's innings at 34 and when Trevor Doecke is caught at deep point the break occurred.

Forty-four runs on, the determined innings by Underwood (33) and from this point Woodside needed to just keep the run rate tightened with the run rate vying up each over.

In the end Cambrai was bowled out for 171 ... 62 runs in arrears with just five overs remaining. During the afternoon, it wasn't front rank bowlers, Bill Oliver, Ker or Rick Hill, who did the work.

It was the fire of Wayne Welden and the art of medium pacer Ian Butcher. These two were involved in the wicket drama which won the final for Woodside over MTC. Welden bowled unchanged three hours taking 4 for 60 from 57 overs. At the other end Butcher yielded 19 successive overs and ended with 1 for 40. It was this effort which kept Cambrai below the eight-ball when it needed 36 runs.

EDEN VALLEY TITLE determined Innings by Darren Slater (109) was the key to Eden Valley's score of 221 ... which red 118 runs too many for Kersbrook in the B-grade final. However, the Kersbrook C-grade team amends, sneaking an exciting wicket win over Barossa.
