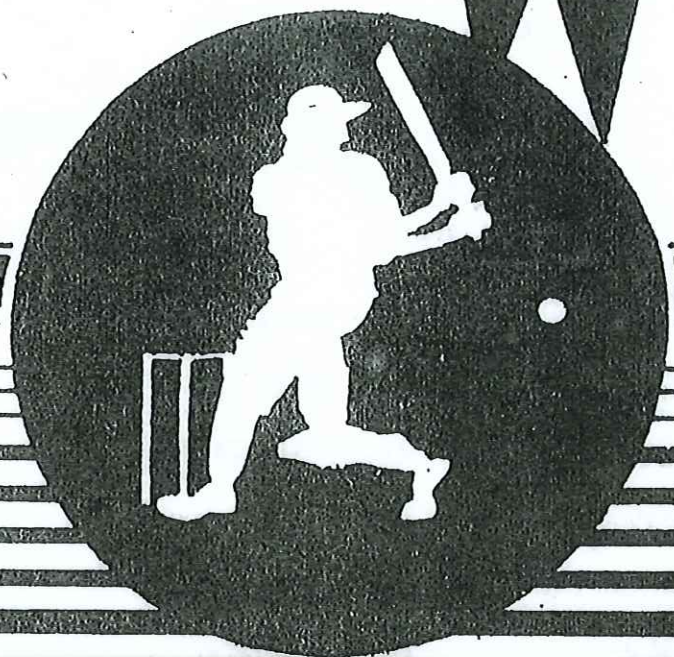

From the situation detailed above you can see that we now show an increased profit carried forward when compared to season 1987/88.

This improvement of \$1200 is mainly due to reduced purchases of equipment and most other activities have produced similar results to last season. We have however spent \$7000 on preparation and practice facilities for the new oval which has been funded to the extent of \$4500 from our term deposit.

Estimates of amounts not included in this report suggest that the result to date may improve slightly when final figures are presented at the Annual General Meeting. This would certainly be the case if all debts were settled.

Your Committee urges all who have any monies outstanding to settle your debts as a matter of urgency so that planning can proceed for next season when considerable funding will be required to update equipment and preparation of the new oval and practice wickets need to be completed.

Once again the use of the Clubrooms has provided significant profit and an ideal atmosphere for after match discussion. Your Treasurer extends on your behalf our thanks to Sue, Lyn, Geof and their helpers, our thanks for looking after us so well and working so hard to help your Club finances.

"A" GRADE REPORT

Although we had a relatively good season, the team as a whole did not reach the heights of the previous season. In each competition there can only be one winner and a number of losers, so it is very important to learn from each loss so that the ultimate can be achieved next season. That has to be the aim of all 12 players involved in the semi-final and if we are fair dinkum in our approach, the T. S. Hannam Shield will return to Woodside in March 1990.

I would just like to say thanks to Duane for his efforts as Vice-Captain this season - it has been really great. Also to Stan Wilson, who again made the effort to travel distances to assist the Woodside Cricket Club achieve the ultimate - alas it was not to be this season - but it certainly was not because of his efforts.

PROFILES 1. DUANE IRELAND

Duane's efforts this season have been outstanding. In my absence for a couple of games he led the team with flair and sound captaincy skills. His batting has continued to develop and has resulted in his maiden century as well as over 400 runs for the season.

These efforts were rewarded when he was selected to represent the Association on Kangaroo Island.

2. BILL OLIVER

He continues to astound most batsmen around the Association with his continual change to his bowling and his fierce desire to take wickets.

He again won the Cricketer of the Year Trophy and regained the "A" Grade bowling crown. His change of pace and his cutters will make him an important member of the attack for seasons to come.

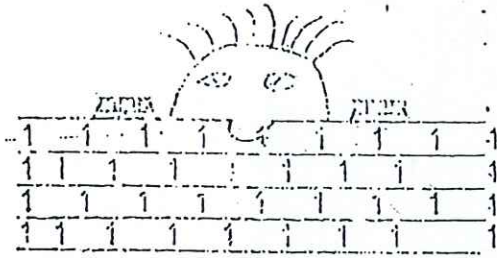

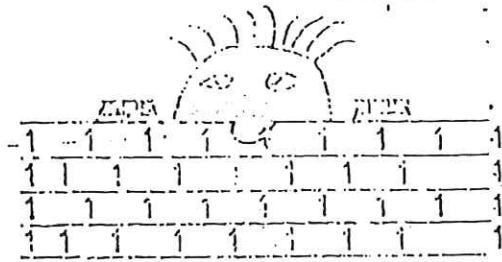
