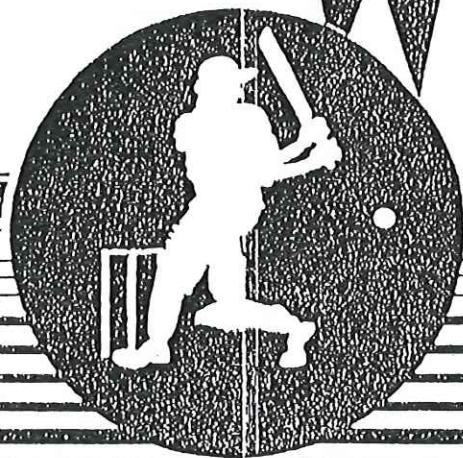

## WOODSIDE CRICKET CLUB ... "B" RED ... 1989-90

I must say, having the opportunity to captain a very young side in senior cricket has given me a great deal of satisfaction.

My views have always been that if a junior player is good enough to play senior cricket, then that is where he should be playing, even if it means a senior player misses out.

Unfortunately a lot of captains are not prepared to give young players any responsibility and you see them batting low in the order and not getting a bowl until a game has been lost.

The RED side was built around 4 under 16 players, MATT DAVIS, STUART KENNY, BRENDAN HAHESEY AND BRADLEY MCLEOD. The improvement shown, and the responsibility taken on by these players has been gratifying.

At the beginning of the season when I looked at the side and saw the number of 12 and 13 year old players, my thoughts were - perhaps we would win a couple of games, have a bit of fun, and hopefully, the lads would learn a few things as well as gain some valuable experience..... To play in the finals was a bonus.

To everybody who played in the side, I say a big thank you. The spirit in which you played the game, and the endeavour shown on the field, made it a pleasure for me to captain the side.

If all teams played the game in the same spirit, the B Grade competition could be a good learning ground for young players. Unfortunately some teams have no interest in the future of cricket in the T.V.C.A., and this is very disappointing.

### PLAYERS PROFILE.....

MATTHEW DAVIS....Opened the batting and was one of the reasons we were so successful. Matthew's partnerships with Brendan Hahesey, often set the side up for large totals. Made his maiden 100 during the season..... Well done!

Bowled very well in the early part of the season picking up a number of wickets. Unfortunately, after his stint in the A'2s, his direction suffered somewhat from not enough bowling. Excellent fieldsman and a player I would expect to play A GRADE next season.

BRENDAN HAHESEY .....Opened with Matt Davis, and the bowling with Stuart Kenny. Brendan's batting has improved tremendously during the season. Probably lacked a little confidence to play shots early, but towards the end of the season was batting well.



As an opening bowler, Brendan picked up a number of wickets with his outswinger. Needs to work on his action a little to bowl a more consistent line. Fielding improved greatly towards the end of the season, 3 catches taken in the final was great stuff. Could develop into a good bowler when he stops growing.

BOB HAHESY ..... Captain of the side, aggressive batsman, who managed to stay in the middle long enough to make a few runs. moon ball bowler, due to age, and first slip fieldsman, due to the same reason.

BRADLEY MCLEOD..... Because of his size and ability, it is easy to forget that Brad was only 13 years of age. For his age, has the ability to concentrate for long periods, a basic necessity for a batsman. Bradley had a good season with the bat..... two noticeable scores of 97 and 80..... both should have been turned into 100's. Probably needs to work a little harder on his game in the nets. Should be trying to practice as often as it is possible, even if it is only getting somebody to throw balls at him.

Needs to tough it out a little more when better bowlers are operating. If prepared to work, could bat at a very high level.

Brad also bowled some very good spells, has the ability to move the ball both ways. Sometimes fails to get his left shoulder side on in delivery. but will improve when he stops growing. Very good fieldsman, either close or in the outfield. Would expect Bradley to perform very well in A2's next season.

BARRY LAMING ..... Right hand batsman, who believes every ball should be played. Started the season very well and was batting with a lot of confidence until his stint in A2.

Barry also took some very important wickets during the season, Needs to concentrate a little harder in the field.

STUART KENNY ..... Opening down wind bowler. Stuart took 38 wickets for the season ..... good effort. Stuart's line and length improved as the season progressed. I think if we looked at the books, a lot of wickets came in the second spell, when we were aiming to bowl line and length. Couple of technique problems in his action and run up which needs some work.

Stuart's batting is somewhat confined to the leg side due to technique problem. If he is prepared to work on his batting, could develop into a useful middle order bat.

Very good fieldsman who took some excellent catches both in the slips and in the outfield. A2 player next season.



TIM GREEN ..... Tim came to us after the season had started and was a very important member of the side. When Matt Davis went up to A2, Tim was used in his opening spot. While Tim has the ability to succeed in that role, he sometimes lets himself down with a poor shot selection at the wrong time. I suspect Indoor Cricket may have contributed to that.

Tim at times was outstanding in the field and could have won the fielding trophy if he hadn't decided to sail to Kangaroo Island half way through the last minor round. I was a little disappointed that he did not make himself available for the final.

I hope Tim continues to play. There is no doubt, if he is prepared to work in the nets, and really wants to play the game, he could enjoy some good seasons.

STEVE THOMAS ..... After being dropped from the Blues, Cadburys was snapped up in the internal draft. Steve really put his mind to the job and was probably our most consistent bowler over the last half of the season. WELL DONE.

Steve also made some useful contributions with the bat. While not quite needing a bag, needs to do a lot of catching practice. Could play A2 if he wants to.

TREV MEGAW ..... Left hand batsman and much improved fieldsman. Trev's batting improved immensely during the season. If anybody saw Trev play the first couple of matches, you would have thought his bat had holes in it. Towards the end of the season a lot of balls were hitting the centre of the bat. Needs to bat a little closer to leg and centre stumps, and move his front foot forward instead of sideways - will then learn to play shots on the leg side. Well done Trev... and we hope you continue to play.

CRAIG MEDLOW ..... Craig was our wicket keeper for the season. For his age his efforts were outstanding. Still needs to concentrate on watching the ball right into his gloves..

Craig's batting improved tremendously during the season and when he grows a little and becomes a little stronger, will make a lot of runs.

As seems to be the trait with a lot of keepers, Craig is not afraid to say a few words... must have got that from his mother.

A very good season by Craig, and I look forward to watching his progress through the grades. No doubt has the ability to play at a very high level if he keeps working hard.. Craig turned 13 on semi final day.

MATTHEW LAMING .... Also in the 13 year old age group. Matthew was one of our regular players during the season. Potentially one of the Clubs future stars. Matthew's bowling action is one of the most technically correct actions I have seen. No doubt when he grows and develops strength we will hear a lot more of Matthew's efforts with both bat and ball.

STEPHEN DOWNS .... Steve's inclusion in the side actually gave us enough licenced drivers to get the players to the games. Also added a little more experience. Unfortunately Steve had a poor season with the bat. Having little trouble bowling sides out, he didn't get many opportunities with the ball. Probably would have played much better if his mind wasn't in Queensland.

ANDREW MANN ... Unfortunately due to work commitments Zooman only played a few games for the Club this season. We were fortunate to have him for 1 match in the semi final. His class was obvious in that match, both with the bat and ball. Really enjoys playing and always give 100%.

We knew if our top order batsmen all failed on the same day we would struggle to make runs. Unfortunately this happened once during the season .... the semi final.

Despite the disappointing finish, the season was most enjoyable and I would like to thank the lads for their time and effort. Thanks also to the parents who supplied transport each Saturday and to those people who did the scoring during the season.

MATTHEW DAVIS .... Captain of the side and handled the side superbly. Opened the batting and usually got the side off to a good start. Still tends to work a few too many balls onto the leg side from off stump, or just outside. We look forward to seeing Matthew's ability develop in the Woodside A Grade in the seasons to come.

BRENDAN HAHESY ..... Vice Captain of the side. Opened the batting with Matt Davis and usually did his job of taking the shine off the ball. Also opened the bowling with Stuart Kenny and this is where his most success came. To finish the season with 21 wickets and win the Association Trophy, speaks for itself. Undoubtedly one of the most improved juniors in the Club.

BRADLEY MCLEOD .... Batted at no. 3, and along with Matt Davis, was our main run scorer. Bradley's potential as a batsman is unlimited. It's now up to Brad to put the work in and make the most of that ability.

Bradley also took a number of wickets during the season, bowling both medium pace and spin.

STUART KENNY .... Stuart opened the bowling and on occasions probably bowled too well to take wickets. Although not getting a lot of wickets himself, was probably one of the reasons. Brendan was so successful at the other end.

Even by Stuart's standards, he had a poor season with the bat in this grade. The coach has pointed out the technique problems which have led to this, now its up to Stuart to correct the problems with sensible practice in the nets.

CRAIG MEDLOW.... Left hand batsmen and wicket keeper. Craig had a good season with the gloves. although there is still room for a lot of improvement. Early in the season tried to be too aggressive too early when he batted and tended to bat across the line of the ball. Became more patient later in the season and made several useful scores. We look forward to watching Craig's abilities develop in the seasons ahead.

DANNY HAHESY ..... Danny has the ability to bat very well if he wants to, just needs to believe in his own ability a little more. May show his talents a little more next season when he has more responsibility. Although not asked to bowl very often, has the ability to bowl a very good line and length.



MATTHEW LAMING ..... Being one of the younger members of the side, Matthew's ability will become more apparent next season. Very good swing bowler who bowls a good line and length. Also has the potential to become a very good batsman. Excellent in the field. We look forward to Matthew excelling next season.

NICK JOHNS ..... Nick's efforts with the ball this season have been outstanding. Delivers close to the stumps and bowls wicket to wicket with the ability to move the ball both ways. If the opening bowlers were having problems bowling the correct line and length, Nick would be introduced to the attack, usually with immediate success.

Left hand batsmen who, at this stage, is too aggressive. Needs to spend a lot more time practicing his batting correctly. Will enjoy batting a lot more if he can temper his aggression.

DAMIEN MILLER.... Left hand batsman and right arm bowler. Damien made a number of useful scores for the side during the season. Like Nick Johns, tends to be too aggressive too early. Needs to listen a little more at practice and try and practice what he has been told. It is no use going to practice just for the sake of going. Practice is for improving your game.

Damien took some very good catches and was an important member of the side.

CLINTON ANDERSON..... Clinton was playing his first season. Has the ability to become a useful bowler if he continues playing the game. Batting still needs a lot of work, but this is understandable, having missed a number of years early coaching. Clint has a very good eye and could develop his batting if he wanted to. Very keen fieldsman with a good arm.

MICHAEL CRESSWELL..... Michael enjoys playing the game. Unfortunately did not have a lot of opportunities to bowl and batting at number 11 on a lot of occasions, doesn't allow for making a lot of runs. Michael puts a lot of energy into his fielding and was a very important team member.

STEVE COVERDALE..... Steve was also playing his first season. Has the ability to be a useful bowler. Batting needs a lot of work. Good fieldsman. Steve also played a number of B Grade games. Well done.

To all the young players of the Club, I say the amount of enjoyment you get out of the game is dependant on what you are prepared to put into it. There is no doubt some of the players have the ability to play at a very high level, however, having the ability and actually achieving those levels is dependant on the amount of work you are prepared to put in developing the basic skills you have, as well as the flair you have shown for the different principles of the game.

As colts we train 1 night a week for 2 hours. All a coach can do in that time is teach the basics of the game. It is up to the players to develop those basics, and the more you practice and play the better you should become.

REMEMBER..... Don't practice just for the sake of practicing. Everytime you pick up a ball or a bat, you should be trying to improve some facet of your game. If you do that you will become much better cricketers and enjoy the game more.

You are never too old to learn..... sometimes too lazy, but never too old.
