A greater input and effort from the younger players in the side will be required next year so that this side can overcome the final obstacle to achieve the ultimate and, basically what everyone plays for, the Premiership.

STEVEN STOKES - The Guru's efforts this year were rewarded with his selection in the Torrens Valley Association side over the January long weekend. His batting matured greatly this year with the responsibility of opening for the side. Like most cricketers, he has the odd weakness and these have been discussed with him, but there is little doubt that he will overcome these problems in the up and coming years. A job very well done this year.

MATT DAVIS - This was Matt's first full year of A Grade cricket and he accounted for himself well. BRADLEY WILLIAMS - While still eligible to play U.13, Bradley was our quickest and main strike bowler. Winning the Club and also the Association Bowling Trophy speaks for itself. Needs to work a little on his delivery stride to get a little closer to the stumps, however, this will come with a little more experience. Potential to become a good alrounder with a little more work on his batting. A very good season first up in U.16's

and look forward to watching his progress.

BRETT MCINNES - Brett's first season in U.16 also. Struggled early with the bat, mainly because he tried to hit the cover off too many balls. Improved as the season progressed and batted very well at Mannum. Needs to work very hard on his action at this stage to rectify some bad habits. I am sure if he is prepared to listen and work hard he will become a very good alrounder in the seasons to come. Brett did some very good work in the field, taking several very good catches.

SCOTT NANKERVIS - Scott was a very important team member who made some useful contributions with the bat late in the order, usually when the team was in trouble. Also bowled very well when asked to do so. Could be a very useful bowler in the years to come if he is prepared to put the time and work in. Scott took several very good catches.

TROY ROBERTS - Troy played for us when he wasn't playing for his school. Has the ability to become a very good batsman. At this stage probably need to play in a little stronger competition a little more regularly. Tended to retreat when facing the quicker bowlers. Did some good work in the field also.

ROBBY GOODWIN - Robby was one of our big improvers over the season. Obviously hadn't played a lot of cricket previously. Could develop into a useful left arm bowler if he wants to continue with the game. Very good arm in the field.

MICHAEL CRESSWELL - Michael was a very good team member until very late in the season when he let the team down. Bowled a number of very good overs of spin as well as making several useful contributions with the bat. Very disappointing finish.
