## PLAYER PROFILE

### A GRADE

#### 1992/93 SEASON

Success is normally measured in results when related to sport. For this it could be suggested that the A Grade has had a very poor year. In relation to results, yes we could have done better than 6th position but when you look at the makeup of the side and the young players playing in their first year of A Grade Cricket then I think our season has been quite fruitful. The lessons that should have been learnt this year will carry the club well for the next few seasons. Thankyou to the assistance given by Andrew Perkins during the year who filled most of the year as Vice Captain after Graham Medlow's injury. Andrew Captained the side in two Courier Cup matches and got us through to the Quarter Finals (side was beaten in the Semi Finals). A special thanks to John Murphy for his scoring this year, you do not realize how easier this makes it for the players on Saturdays. Again, I hope that people will not become disillusioned over our table position this year as I believe the club is set up now for the next few years.

**ANDREW PERKINS:** Perks took over the Vice Capt when Graham injured himself trying to break Ben Johnson's sprint record (this time using legs not hands and mouth). Perks bore the brunt of the new ball attack. Whilst by his standards he did have a great season he was still competitive every time he went onto the Oval. Represented the TVCA in Murray Bridge for the Meyer Shield.

**BILL OLIVER:** Never ceases to amaze. He gets better with age. Bill was one of the great losers over the weather this year when set for his first ever ton, but he can tell the story with tears and all. Bill was used as an opening batsman on occasions and was used as a 'stock' bowler this year and did both with the intensity he normally does, and the results prove it.

**MATT DAVIS:** Was used at Number 3 this year and settled in quite easily. At that position the batting had more stability about it. Matt seemed to become a little impatient in some of his innings. His fielding was of a high standard again. The club will start to look at big things from Matt now that he has had two full seasons in A Grade. Was selected in the TVCA Meyer Shield squad.

**STEVE ROWLANDS:** Was bought up into A grade this year and used as an Opener. Did not make a truck load of runs but did what was asked of him. Was given a hard job this year but tackled the task well. His availability towards the end of the year was a bit unsettling for him and his performance fell away a little bit.

**CRAIG MEDLOW:** The first of the "young ones" to come along. Craig was wicket keeper for the year and performed extremely well against a variety of bowling. His batting is compact and correct and as he grows his strength will increase his effectiveness as a batsman to one of the top ones in this competition. Craig does not lack confidence and this attribute will stand him in good stead in whatever direction he takes his cricket.

**TIM JOHNS:** Tim's improvement in the batting has put him into the allrounder class. He was probably not used as much as last year in the bowling department but made very good progress with the bat. Tim must ensure that he works hard next year as he will become an integral part of the side over the next few years.

**MATT SCHULTZ:** Matt played his first season of A Grade cricket this year. Matt opened the bowling all year and his performance was outstanding. Matt uses basic principles of bowling and this lesson could be learnt by everyone and the success he has obtained is due to this reason. His fielding is excellent and his batting will improve with increased concentration at the crease.

Rick fights hard everytime he is on the cricket field whether he is batting or bowling and as a captain you probably couldn't a person easier to Captain. Fleurieu's captain was Damien King, who was chosen as the best field-



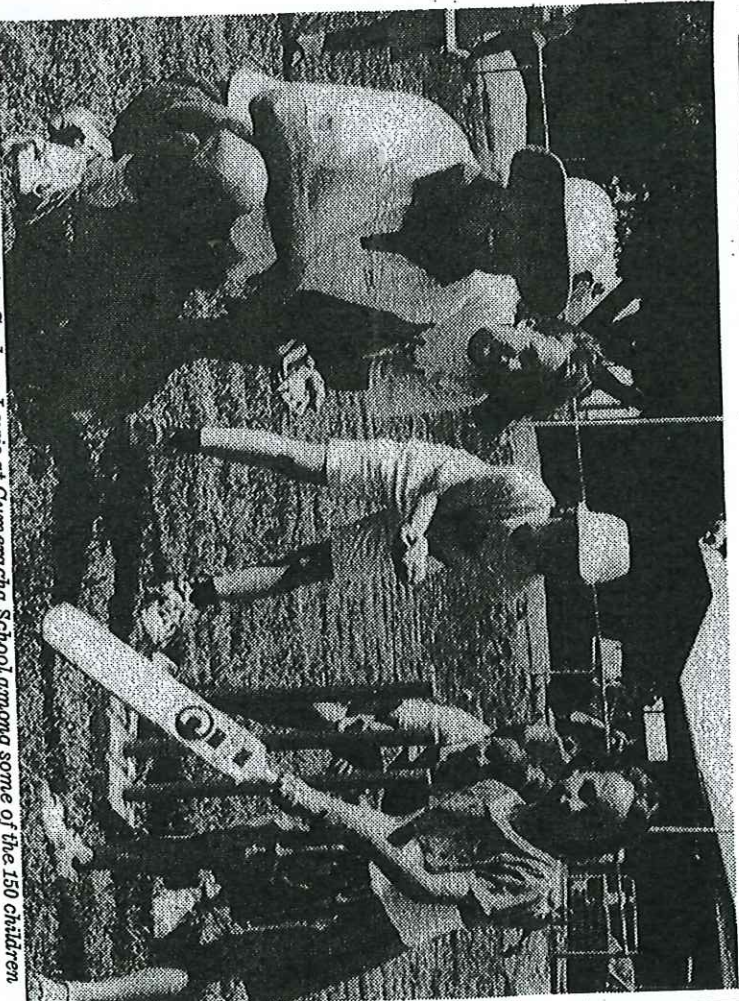
