No fewer than 60 young cricketers represented the Warriors this season in five junior age groups ranging from U-16.5 through U-14s, U-12s to U-10s. To simply field so many youngsters is an amazing achievement in itself and one that has most other clubs shaking their heads in disbelief and envy.

There have been many occurrences of note throughout the season, the most significant being the U-14 Red team winning the inaugural TVCA U-14 Premiership. Coached by Craig Medlow, these lads were by far the best team in the competition as their undefeated season proves. Their win will always be a "first" as it is the first time an U-14 competition has been conducted by the TVCA and of course, they are therefore the first Woodside CC team to win an U-14 premiership. Well done. You are worthy champions and have earned your slice of history. I'm quietly confident that with the depth of talent in our U-14s more premierships are not too far away.

Along with the Premiership, many of our cricketers have enjoyed individual successes throughout the season which deserve mention. These are summarised below:

- Scott Handke (U-14 Blue) Winner of the TVCA U-14 Bowling trophy with 10 wickets.
- Dylan Thompson (U-14 Red) Winner of the TVCA U-14 Bating trophy with 227 runs in the minor rounds. Another undefeated 60 runs in the finals gives him 287 for the entire season.

To finish off I've written a few short words about each of the kids and how they played during the season and I hope this will encourage them to continue next season.

Matt Hollitt - A very good all round performance throughout the season from Matt who is one of our more experienced players. He made 202 runs with the bat at 13.46.

Matt Gardner - I found Matt to be quite experienced considering he is only 8. Batting is his strong point. He made 178 runs at 12.7.
