After 20 years in recess, Woodside Cricket Club reformed in 1980.

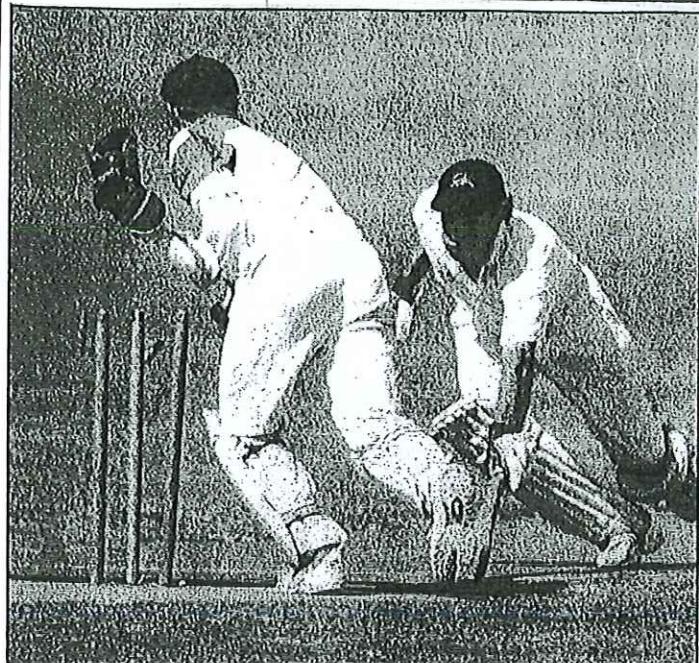
During the presentation of trophies, Steven Haesy was announced as Woodside's cricketer of the year, including the club's A Grade best batting performance.

Wicketkeeper Medlow was last man out with 148 in the book. He was one of two players caught by Damien King, who shone in the field as much as with the bat.

Medlow (31) and Michael Bohmer (14) made the Woodside score more respectable.

Lobethal's five pronged attack led by Kevin Sloan (3/26) and Andrew Frohling (4/33) had done its job of keeping Woodside down to less than three runs an over.

And the catch taken by Jason Sziller to dismiss Tim Johns just three balls into the game was to set a high standard in the field which made runs hard to get.

### Best catch

"That was the best catch I've seen in my six years of SACA umpiring," said international umpire Ashley Hunter, who officiated on Sunday with Sam Vaughan.

Sziller, who bowled 10 economical overs during Woodside's innings, later went on to make a topscoring and unbeaten 49 in Lobethal's winning score of 6/149.

Woodside rued dropping Sziller early in his innings, before promising off spinner Michael Klose wove a spell with some guile of his own.

Well supported by keeper Medlow, Klose claimed the wickets of Damien King, Trevor Hill, and Scott Graeber to temporarily put a hold on the Lobethal run.

The 17 year old Klose finished 3/41 from 10 overs of teasing flight and spin.

But his effort was in vain as Lobethal cruised to its third inter-association Courier Super Challenge title in eight years, and must be hailed as 'The Kings' of Hills cricket.

Lobethal received \$575 for its effort of four wins during The Courier series.

# Bohmer's 10 wickets wrecks Gumeracha

An amazing 10 wicket haul has rocketed left arm paceman Michael Bohmer toward Meyer Farm paceman in the Torrens Valley Cricket Association.

He took six wickets in the first innings as Gumeracha was bowled out for 113 and another four in the second, when Woodside attempted an outright win.

A blooming Bohmer, with deceptive pace and ability to swing the ball sharply in at right handed batsmen, set Woodside up for an outright attempt in Torrens Valley cricket in his 35 over stint, which resulted in match figures of 10/85.

But although having Gumeracha 7/35 in its second innings with still an hour to play in the match, Woodside had to settle for 23 game points as Gumeracha's tail wagged and held on, frustrating the Warriors out of 10 extra points for the outright.

Bohmer (or Big M) picked up three of his 10 wickets when Gumeracha slumped to 3/24 at stumps on the first Saturday of the game, after Woodside had made 228.

He continued his onslaught picking up Chris Cooper (22), Jon Morley (62) and Scott Wilton in his unchanged spell of 21 overs as Gumeracha fell for 113.

After the mandatory 10 minute break, Bohmer took up the attack as Gumeracha tried to stave off outright defeat.

Within minutes Gumeracha had slumped to 5/33 as Bohmer sent back Cooper, Craig Cornish, Morley and Paul Trimmer.

## Five wickets to Johns

As Army officer Graham Johns chipped in with a third wicket — making it five for the game — as Gumeracha's second innings at 7/35 was seemingly a lost cause.

But the next breakthrough was a longer time in coming.

Tailenders Paul Maxwell and left handed Wilton hung in to frustrate Woodies during an unexpected late 41 run partnership for the eighth wicket.

Yet when they left, and the score was 9/74, the outright still seemed likely.

But Billy Thorpe and last man Peter Clark stood firm through six tense overs.

The end came as Gumeracha on 9/94, had hero Thorpe (15 not out) and Clark (0 n.o.).

The first innings win lifted the premiers back to fourth spot, but the extra 10 points from the outright win would have pushed Woodside into third place.

## Lobethal on top

Meanwhile, the TVCA premiership ladder under went wholesale changes in the sixth round.

Lobethal climbed to top position after beating previous top team Mannum by seven wickets.

Mannum's score of 8/196 was never going to be enough once Lobethal's Trevor Hill (59) and Jason King (43) put on a 90 run opening partnership, despite Jason Sziller making only 15.

## Houghton loses three in a row

After winning three early games pacesetter Houghton has come up against tough times with its third straight loss on Saturday. Houghton is now in fifth place.

Lenswood Ranges set Houghton 281 runs from 70 overs to win this vital match.

Although Darren Hills (23) and Kym Bernardi (49) gave Houghton early hope, they then lost 4/30, which saw the score slump to 7/125.

Tim White (59) and Paul Farrin (29) enjoyed a late recovery but Houghton's 217 was well below the required amount and three runs short of a sixth batting points.

Nineteen year old bowler Michael Golding picked up three wickets on Saturday bringing his total to 15 for the season, level with Paracombe's Nigel Downes, Bohmer, and Kevin Sloan, who played for Kersbrook before transferring to Lobethal, and one wicket behind the association leader Graham Johns (16) of Woodside.

Paracombe gain early wickets

The loss of four quick wickets, including Peter and Kym Vivian, had Mt Pleasant/Springton reeling against the early pace of Paracombe's Peter Hills and Nick Gilles.

But the Innings built up as youngsters Joel Drewett (47) and Anthony Vivian (24) showed maturity, Richard Comber played enterprisingly for an unbeaten 22 and veteran David Kroehn cracked 24.

Mt Pleasant/Springton finished with 173 in replay to Paracombe's 243.

In the 16 overs before stumps Paracombe went for the runs and scored 80 in its second Innings.

Keen fielding from Mt Pleasant/Springton with four run outs took the second Innings honors. The Northerns picked up 1.6 points for grabbing eight wickets.

## Graeber Trophy

In a third and final qualifying round of the Graeber Trophy series Saturday, Houghton (35 points), Mannum (32) and Lenswood Ranges (31) play for positions in the final of the one day series at Lobethal on January 21.

Lobethal (22) and Woodside (20) could make the final if they beat Houghton and Mannum, respectively, in this last group of games before new year.

Woodside (36), Mannum and Mt Torrens/Charleston (34), Birdwood (33) and Cambrai (22) are engaged five way struggle for three places in the Graeber Cup qualifying games. Only three teams will qualify for the semifinals.

Fourth place in the 'Cup' contest goes to the B grade team gaining the most points from three one day games. Saturday is the second round. The third is on January 6.

The Graeber Cup semifinals will be played on January 21.

# 'Big M' skittles Lobethal

Left arm paceman Michael Bohmer snatched seven wickets on Saturday as Woodside skittled Lobethal for a shock victory on the first innings in Torrens Valley cricket.

A genial giant, 'Big M' (Bohmer) dispelled fears of an arm injury sustained against Houghton on January 6, and will spearhead the TVCA attack during the Meyer Shield three day cricket carnival on Kangaroo Island beginning on Friday.

Bohmer bowled 25 overs in two spells Saturday, claiming the wickets of Trevor Hill, Jason Sziller, Scott Graeber, Jason Oborn, Damien King, Andrew Day and tallener Chris Hill to finish with 7/39 in a fantastic matchwinning effort.

Saturday's seven wicket haul lifted Bohmer into second place behind Nigel Downes (Paracombe) as the season's highest wicket taker. Bohmer has 24 wickets.

Bohmer's fiery bowling sent Lobethal crashing to 4/28 chasing Woodside's 203.

Apart from Jason Sziller (50) and Damien King (23) who steadied Lobethal's innings with a 60 run fifth wicket stand, and a belated 44 from Chris Graeber in the tail, the innings crumbled for 156.

And it could have been worse had Woodside not dropped several easy chances.

Woodside scored 20 match points from Saturday's result, moving to within 11 points of Lobethal in top place with only two further two-day games remaining.

## Houghton wins outright

In another surprise result Houghton (fifth) clawed its way back into finals contention with an outright win over a disappointing Mt Pleasant/Springton.

## MT PLEASANT/SPRINGTON CRASHES FOR 52

Houghton, which won three games early in the season, was looking at a sixth successive loss before Saturday's strange set of circumstances evolved.

Mt Pleasant/Springton resumed at 1/18 needing another 118 runs for a win. Within an hour Houghton had ripped its opponent apart and led by 84 runs.

Fast bowler Paul Farrin bowled himself into the TVCA Meyer Shield team by taking 6/18 from 15 unchanged overs as Mt Pleasant/Springton fell for only 52.

Houghton went for quick runs in the second innings before declaring at 4/100.

Marty Rees' declaration gave the northerners 185 runs to win from 40 overs.

Meyer Shield skipper Peter Vivian opened with a quick 46, and with Kym Vivian (44) and Richard Comber (36) getting on bandwagon, the Mt Pleasant based raced to 4/164, needing only 21 more with overs and time to spare.

But with a shaky tail and two players at the travelling was never easy.

Late wickets to Rees and Tim White cut the loss of six wickets for 14, leaving Pleasant/Springton eight runs short with overs to play.

Lenswood Ranges young medium Matt Schultz cleaned up on Saturday

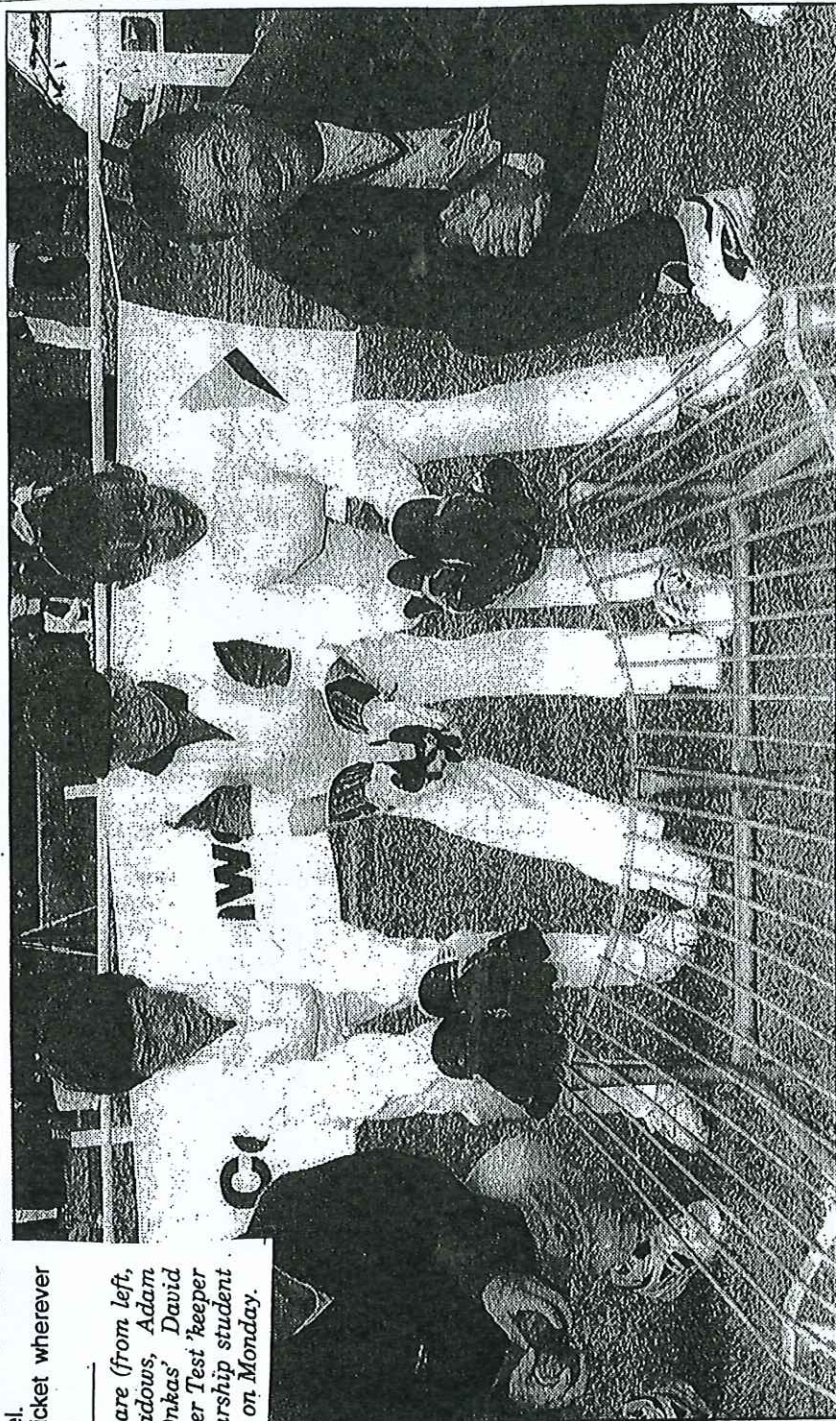
With Marsh were the interstate cricketers now attending the AIS class of 1995.

# Super Challenge final

## showdown

Lobethal and Woodside meet head to head in the final of *The Courier* Super Challenge Cricket Trophy at Nairne this Sunday.

It will be the second all-Torrens Valley final in eight seasons, but will not lessen the rivalry which has developed for this prestigious trophy, according to co-ordinator Trevor Graeber.

"This *Courier* sponsored inter-association club championship is unique, giving 18 teams — the top six teams from last summer from Torrens Valley, Hills and Alexandra & Eastern Hills — a chance to play competitively against each other."

"And although the two teams in this season's final are from Torrens Valley, the rivalry between Woodside and Lobethal will make this quite a game," the co-ordinator suggests.

And captains Steve Haesey and Scott Graeber agree.

Scott Graeber who played with East Torrens for five seasons before returning home, was a more cagey about his comments, but said he expected Lobethal to be at full strength for this final, which Lobethal had been won twice previously — 1991 & 1992.

"When we are at full strength our fielding has often won us matches," he said.
