After recess


After 20 years in recess, Woodside Cricket Club reformed in 1980.

Woodside rued dropping Sziller early in his innings, before promising off spinner Michael Klose wove a spell with some guile of his own.

Well supported by 'keeper Mediow, Klose claimed the wickets of Damien King, Trevor Hill, and Scott Graeber to temporarily put a hold on the Lobethal run.

The 17 year old Klose finished 3/41 from 10 overs of teasing flight and spin.

But his effort was in vain as Lobethal cruised to its third inter-association *Courier* Super Challenge title in eight years, and must be halled as 'The Kings' of Hills cricket.

A blooming Bohmer, with deceptive pace and ability to Fa swing the ball sharply in at right handed batsmen, set 101 Woodside up for an outright attempt in Torrens Valley cricket in his 35 over stint, which resulted in match figures of 10/85.

But although having Gumeracha 7/35 in its second innings with still an hour to play in the match, Woodside had to settle for 23 game points as Gumeracha's tall wagged and held on, frustrating the Warriors out of 10 extra points for the outright.

Within minutes Gumeracha had slumped to 5/33 as Bohmer sent back Cooper, Craig Cornish, Morley and Paul Trimper.

Five wickets to Johns

As Army officer Graham Johns chipped in with a third wicket — making it five for the game — as Gumeracha's second innings at 7/35 was seemingly a lost cause.

But the next breakthrough was a longer time in

coming.

Tailenders Paul Maxwell and left handed Wilton hung in to frustrate Woodies during an unexpected late 41 run partnership for the eight wicket.

Yet when they left, and the score was 9/74, the outright still seemed likely.

But Billy Thorpe and last man Peter Clark stood firm through six tense overs.

The end came as Gumeracha on 9/94, had hero Thorpe (15 not out) and Clark (0 n.o.).


