




## Cricket life membership to Oliver

West Lakes resident Bill Oliver occasions, and won the Torrens Valley has travelled for more than a decade and a half — sometimes twice a weekend — to bat and bowl for Woodside cricket teams.

In recognition, he was recently awarded with life membership of the Torrens Valley Cricket Association.

TVCA president Kevin Coulter made the presentation at an end of season function. As a youngster playing in East Torrens District cricket teams, Oliver appeared to have a bright future. However work forced him to forgo a career in the sport.

He was offered an opportunity to play country cricket at Woodside in 1982.
Two of his mates travelled weekly from

West Lakes, so he accepted this chance. Oliver went on to score 3625 runs during his 17 years with the Woodside club.

He also secured 396 wickets. During this period, Oliver was chosen as Woodside's cricketer of the year on six. association's bowling trophy three times.

He was involved with Woodside during its A-grade premiership-winning seasons of 1986, 1988 and 1995, and represented TVCA at Meyer Shield level several times.

Retired as a player, Oliver made himself available to select and coach both the Torrens Valley Figg Shield (under 21) team and Meyer Shield side during the past season.

The under 21s team played and won three games, including the Figg Shield

TVCA's Meyer Shield senior team was beaten in the final by Southern Cricket Association.

This is evidence that Oliver got the best out of all his players.

During the life membership presentation, SACA regional cricket director Graham Medlow outlined his contribution to local cricket before TVCA president presented Oliver with his award.






