B.J. has also taken many a wicket with those "bloody" in swing out dipping balls that don't come on to the bat and in the field, whether behind the stumps or in the outfield, can and does do that thing out of the ordinary to get a side back on top.

B.J. like many of us who have been around the club for many years have had many ups and downs. He has had the misfortune of playing in losing grand finals in each of the Senior Grades but has had the joy of being a premiership Captain of the A2's in 200/02. In later years he progressed to the Under15s playing under Bob Hahesy as coach in the mornings and with the B Grade in the afternoons, also under Bob's guidance. Figures show I had a good year with the bat but still my shot selection gets me out more often then a good ball. With a bit more concentration I think I could have done a lot more.


Again I would like to thank all of the players. As I mentioned earlier, we had a great group and got along very well which made the season entertaining and enjoyable.

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B GRADE REPORT

This is the first year for some time that the club has had a B Grade Team.

Originally, there was some reluctance to have a third team because we weren't sure of the numbers. Yes, there were problems but we didn't forfeit but we have always been that one or two players short.

As a result, we have had thirty cricketers play for us over the season. A few of these are players who would normally play in higher grades and some of the regular B Graders have been elevated to the A2's during the season.

The club has persevered with the B Grade Team and I congratulate it on doing so. I believe that all of those regulars in the Team have enjoyed themselves and I hope that they would like to continue playing regular cricket. Not only that but since the end of the season, two new players have heard how we went and have said that they would like to play.

Unfortunately, our results weren't that good. What started out as a successful year fell apart as the season progressed. Half way through the season we found ourselves on top of the table and I think that this lulled us into a false sense of security as it turned out that we had only played the bottom half of the table.

Coming up against the top half of the table, we struggled although I think that towards the end of the season we were starting to regroup. I also think that at the halfway mark we started wanting to win more than enjoying ourselves and as a consequence, we put unnecessary pressure on ourselves.

The B Grade is a team for people who are not as skilled or are returning to cricket and it provides a vehicle for those who want to play a more social game.

At the same time, we have also tried to bring on a number of the Under 16 players and to introduce them to the senior teams. I hope that they have discovered that it is not so hard and for some of them, the Under 16 competition may be more competitive.

I hope that those U16s have enjoyed the experience and that they will move up through the ranks of the club.

Outstanding performances through the year with the bat were Greg Baschiera with 295 runs, John Hart with 225 runs, Craig Smith with 203 runs, Matt Baschiera with 180 runs, and Jim Hennessy with 133 runs.

I would particularly like to thank Jim Hennessy who unhesitatingly opened in the second half of the season, even when injured. Not only did he treasure his own wicket but he provided real support for whomever he was batting with. The major wicket takers were Lachlan Hemsley with 17, Craig Smith and Matt Baschiera, both with 12 wickets and Nick Turner and Jim Staude, both with 8 wickets.

Jim Staude gets a special mention for a 5 wicket haul in one innings against Kersbrook in round 4.

It is no surprise that all of the top wicket takers are the Under 16's who represent the future of the club.

They may not have realised that I was listening closely to what they said, but the feedback that I got from them was invaluable.
