During his time at Woodside he captained the "A" Grade to a Grand Final. He scored 2800 plus runs and took 117 wickets.

ADRIAN REYNOLDS

Adrian was the inaugural winner of the association wicketkeeping trophy. His glovework was outstanding and he made some very solid contributions with the bat down in the lower order. Muffy was a member of the A2 premiership when the club won 3 out of 4 senior premierships.

MATT DAVIS

Matt was an outstanding junior cricketer. He worked very hard at his game to make the No3 position his own. He was part of the record partnership for the club with Michael Wescombe. He has scored over 5500 runs for the club. He was an outstanding fieldsman who won the association fielding trophy and also a handy medium bowler. He is also a past captain of the club.

AARON GALVIN




DAVID WESCOMBE



MEMORIES OF A PRESIDENT

The Woodside Cricket Club has now been reformed for 25 years. In that time it has grown from a club of 2 senior teams and one under 15 to be one of the strongest clubs of the Torrens Valley Cricket Association.

Over the years the club which started with the Woodside Hotel as its home, to renting the now clubrooms from the Stirling Soccer Club, then gaining the clubrooms in their own rights and now being a licensed club- an incredible journey for just a cricket club.

The match and practice facilities have undergone an enormous change. The team started with no nets and an oval that had a short boundary on the clubroom side. When the club started to grow we even looked at the old Charleston oval before using the oval at the army camp and now with the main oval being a real cricket oval and the Gale oval perfect for junior cricket the club has its teams when playing at home at one venue. The club took time to be able to afford nets - so we trained on the centre wicket then used temporary nets at the Army Camp before building 3 nets at Woodside. This has since been extended to 5 nets making these the best training facilities in the area. Also the club in the 90's purchased a bowling machine.

The most important part of any club and especially the Woodside Cricket Club has been the people that have made the club what it is today. Let's take a journey down memory lane.

MEDLOW FAMILY

Graham was a member of the 1st 'A' Grade team to represent the reformed Woodside. Graham became President of the club in 1983 and soon established a band of willing helpers to assist. One of this band was his wife Sue. Her assistance initially was behind the scenes while raising Annette and Craig, but increased quickly as the two youngsters became devoted cricket and Woodside Club followers. Much of this came from the many test matches with the Davis, Johns and Klose children. Graham cast his influence on and off the field with many credible performances with the bat, ball and gloves as well as his leadership of successful teams over the years. A man of vision Graham initiated the TVCA junior competitions as well as having the club a place to call home. At the clubrooms Sue was the leader of the band in improving the amenities and by providing meals for the many senior and junior players and their families who gathered at the clubrooms to celebrate or commiserate on the endeavours of the day. Annette and Craig along with Matt Davis began coaching junior teams resulting in both Under 14 teams playing off in a Grand Final. Craig was junior co-ordinator as well as coaching premiership junior teams, he coached Fleurieu North U/16 teams (2 winning carnival teams) as well as captaining the 'A' Grade. Sue was treasurer of the club for many years. Graham continued as President while he had other roles including President of the TVCA, Regional Country Co-ordinator for SACA as well as player and junior coach. Over the years the Medlow house has always been a second home for players for a feed, a bed and a chat about lives and cricket. Their influence on the club during these first 25 years is a credit to their endeavours as a family who is readily acknowledged by all who know them. With Graham assisting with training and mentoring players, grand-daughter Taylor playing Have-a Go and Craig contemplating a twilight return to Woodside may their influence continue for many years.

HAHESY FAMILY

Bob was a member of the first "A" Grade team. Bob opened the bowling with Duane Ireland that particular game. Bob also coached the colts in the first season and for many more seasons. Bob was captain of the "B" grade when they won the clubs 1st senior premiership. Throughout his career Bob was on the committee of the club and committed to improving junior cricket. His wife Barbara contributed in many ways to the club. The club ran trading tables in the early years and a lot of the produce on those tables came from the Hahesy household. Steven, Brendan and Danny all played cricket at both junior and seniors for the club. Steven represented the association at junior and senior, captained the club, played in 2"A" Grade premiership teams and is a very gifted cricketer. Brendan represented the association at junior level. Danny was a member of the first junior premiership.

GALE FAMILY

Robert or "Bill" as he prefers to be known has contributed more than most to the success of the Woodside Cricket Club through his off field exploits. Bill as a cricketer was best known as "stonewall Jackson" and he does hold the record of batting more overs than accumulating runs. Bill was the 2nd president of the club but it's his work on the oval that has enabled the club to become some much stronger. Bill designed and facilitated through council the watering system and the second oval which was named after his family. Bill's efforts were also required when the second oval was enlarged making it the best cricket oval in the association. His work continues today as councillor and through the recreation ground committee. His wife, Jan in the early years was a major fundraiser for the club and her efforts enabled the club to move forward much quicker than it normally would have.

PETER JOHNS FAMILY

Peter is the longest serving committee person of the club. Peter's record as a player pales into insignificance in comparison to his administration work. Peter has spent many years promoting junior sport and it is through his efforts that Torrens Valley now has a junior program equal to any country association in South Australia. Peter's work in junior cricket with Woodside, Torrens Valley, Fleurieu North and schools has been outstanding. His efforts with the scores for the club and gaining access to the "Courier" for junior cricket has promoted the sport to many people. Tim has represented the association at underage level and played in the 3rd senior premiership. He also spent a number of seasons as secretary of the club. Nick the current "A" Grade skipper has represented the association at both senior and junior level and was a member of the 1st junior premiership. Nick has spent a number of years on the committee including the very active social committee in the 90's

PAT NESBIT

Pat was a member of the 1st "A" Grade team-also a member of the 1st "A" Grade premiership team. He was the 1st secretary of the club and laid the foundation for all hard working secretaries. Pat was the first barperson; he made great profits and ran some unusual closing times while in charge. Pat will also be remembered for his after dark activities as well as his speech at the 10 year reunion.

DUANE IRELAND

Duane was a member of the first "A" Grade team as well as the first 2 "A" Grade premierships. Duane later captained the club as well as representing the club at underage and senior level. He served on the committee for many seasons and also will be remembered for some after dark activities.

RICK HILL FAMILY

Rick is the only player to have played 25 seasons of cricket with Woodside. Rick played in the first "A" Grade team and now has 2 premierships and one "A2" premiership. Rick has represented the association at Underage and senior cricket. Rick has served in varying roles on the committee and at the moment is a member of the junior committee. His record of red ink will probably never be beaten and could be a record in country cricket. Michelle has been in the background but has helped with teas and any major fundraising events. Ryan and Jayden now play junior cricket and will keep the Hill family involved for a few more seasons. Also part of the Hill family we should mention Geoff, Rick's father, who loved his cricket and was the first practice manager that the club had — a sad loss.

BILL OLIVER

Bill contributed an enormous amount to the club for a person that lived at West Lakes. Bill played in the first season after being conned by John Luker. His record of 3 "A" Grade premierships- numerous bowling trophys, numerous cricketer of the year awards are testiment to his skill as a cricketer. He also represented the association at senior level. Bill was also known for his love of hitting sixes and during his time hit many and eventually scored that elusive century for the Club

STEPHEN THOMAS

Stephen came to the club late a season and by the start of the next had already scored the name "Cadburys". He was a real contributor to the club- firstly as a player where he spent many a season captaining the "A2" side and also groundsman. The biggest disappointment to Cadburys was the failure to capture that premiership as A2 captain; but that was really all he failed to do in his time at Woodside. He was also one of those players that were active after dark.

WAYNE WEIDENHOFER

After a number of years playing with Onkas, Wayne decide it was time to play for a real cricket club. Wayne played significant roles in 2 "A" Grade premierships and a "B" Grade premiership. Apart from his playing ability Wayne was a very good secretary, junior coach and worker for the club. His partnership with Pat Nesbit was formed and the activities of those two could fill a book — especially for a local policeman.

DAVID CATHRO

David played a vital role in our early years. He was one of the elder statesmen both on and off the field. David batted No3 in the first "A" Grade premiership. His efforts as treasurer set the scene for this club to be one of the most financial in the area. No one at the time will forget Dave's ability to coach batting with a broom.

BOB McCULLOCH/JOHN LUKER.

It is important to combine these 2 players. They made the "B" Grade teams competitive and along the way won premierships. Bob captained for a number of years and served on the committees as well as one year as President. John hailed from Glenelg and won numerous bowling trophies in the lower grades.

GRAEME JOHNS FAMILY

Graeme started his career at Woodside after Courtney convinced him there were older people than him playing "A" Grade. Graeme become an active member of the committee and a player of real quality. Graeme played in the 3rd "A" Grade premiership. He was vice-president and chairman of the junior committee while on the committee. His work at junior level was outstanding as was his work at Torrens Valley, Fleurieu North and SACA level. Courtney played both junior and senior cricket. He was an association representative at junior level as well as captaining Fleurieu North at an Under 16 country championship. He played 3 seasons of U16 Fleurieu North cricket with a record of 11 wins from 12 matches. He was also a member of premiership teams for Woodside at U14 and U16 level. Shannon and Lauren were active members of the social committee in the 90's while Jill assisted with teas every Saturday night.

JAMES FAMILY

Peter and Margaret while together, worked tirelessly for junior cricket at Woodside. Peter apart from this also umpired senior cricket and spent a reasonable amount of time at the bar. Margaret coached the U10's and was always there to assist at higher levels. Brock was an outstanding junior cricketer and was captain of both association and Fleurieu North U16 teams. Brock captained a winning U16 premiership team while Gareth was a member of successful U14 teams.

MICK MOLLER

Mick joined the committee as bar manager for a period of 2 years. Mick taught us how to run a professional bar and when and where to buy- he turned our bar profit up by 100%. In ensuring years this continued under other bar managers setting the club up to be even stronger financially. Unfortunately Mick is no longer with us and his final farewell was held in the Woodside clubrooms.

WESCOMBE FAMILY

Doug has given this club great service as a cricketer and committee person. Doug captained lower grade teams and was a successful captain and played in the last A2 premiership team. Doug worked on the committee has covered the areas of equipment and groundsman- in both of these positions he has done excellent jobs as can be seen by the conditions of the ovals. Michael played senior cricket and represented the association at underage and senior level. He holds the club record score of 250 and was an outstanding cricketer. Dave played junior cricket and represented the association and Fleurieu North. He also played in 3 U/16 premiership teams. His efforts at senior level has now seen him win the Geoff Hill Cricketer of the year trophy on several occasions and he has taken a hat trick at "A" Grade level as well as scoring centuries.

BJ DRUWITT

B.J. has played all grades for the club and is captain of the last A2 premiership team. As a committee member BJ has filled many positions as well as being president for a number of seasons. He has taken over the statistics of the club and his efforts in this area are outstanding-BJ has scored many centuries for the club. He will by the end of his career be the leading run getter for the club. He has been joined by his brother A.J., who is now starting to make a name for himself in his own right.

He was a member of the last 'A2' premiership team. Paul was a very handy junior cricketer. The family were very involved in the widening of the main oval – their efforts have certainly helped in making this oval the best cricket ground in the area.

Greg has served the club as a very good lower grade cricketer and as a committee person. He certainly knows how to handle a cricket bat and sets an excellent role model. Greg has also handled the duty of bar manager for a few seasons and again set high standards. His sons Matt and Chris are both cricketers of great promise. Chris is currently playing 'A' Grade as a first change bowler and this season took 7 wickets against Birdwood. Matt has also played 'A' Grade and shows real promise as a medium pace bowler. They are both outstanding fieldsmen.

HEMSLEY FAMILY




And, of comical Bill Gale who, when he opens his mail, Has a quip for us all be we big or small, And makes us laugh, he never fails.





Warriors celebrate 25th anniversary

Woodside Cricket Club took the opportunity to not only recognise its leading performers, but also celebrate the club's anniversary, during its annual presentation function last Saturday evening.

A crowd of about 120 people was in attendance at the Woodside Institute, with several past players travelling from interstate and country regions to mark the 25th season since Woodside's Warriors reformed following a lengthy recess of cricket in the town.

Torrens Valley Association president Kevin Coulter and secretary Colin Checker also attended, together with 15 of the Woodside club's 16 life members.

In a special highlight to mark the Warriors' milestone, a team featuring the best 11 players judged from the past 25 years was announced, with those members or representatives present receiving a commemorative bottle of wine, featuring the team displayed upon the label.

With nine of the 10 A-grade captains who have led the club in attendance, many reminiscent stories of the Warriors' history added to the occasion.

While past champions were honored, current leading lights within Warriors' ranks were also feted.

Dave Wescombe scored the major share of trophies for the A-grade team, taking out the batting award with 448 runs at an average of 40.73, and also securing bowling honors with 32 wickets at an average of 14.13.

On receiving the 'cricketer of the year' award for a fourth successive season, Wescombe made special reference

rather than individual success, reflecting on a 2006-07 campaign in which Woodside was among the A-grade pacesetters, before disappointingly losing a semifinal encounter against Cambral.

Wicketkeeper James Marshall was the recipient of the fielding award, while the A-grade 'most valuable player' trophy was bestowed upon past skipper Matt Johnston.

After taking out the association's A2-grade batting trophy, Brenton Druwitt was similarly awarded for the Woodside club, having made 572 runs, at an average of 52.

Druwitt was also honored with the coveted Mick Moller Memorial Award, recognising his service to junior development within the Woodside club.


The Peter Johns Clubman Award was presented to Harry Gelzinis.

TORRENS VALLEY CRICKET

Cambrai allrounder Greg Falkenberg has taken out the Torrens Valley Cricket Association's highest individual award, the Ken Hanna Trophy.

The award, which honors past Gumeracha champion player Ken Hanna, is annually presented to the A-grade 'cricketer of the year, based on umpires' votes.

Formerly presented at an end of season function, Torrens Valley officials opted for a change in format this year, with various awards presented at the grand final venues for the particular grades.

Falkenberg was presented with the 2006-07 Hanna award following his side's defeat at the hands of Lobethal in the

Despite losing the title-decider, Cambrai completed a A-grade final. rather successful season, rising from bottom spot last season to runner-up.

A large majority of the improved performances stemmed from the input of Falkenberg, who polled 18 votes to win the competition's highest individual award.
