

PRESIDENTS REPORT 2011

Fantastic - the club finally celebrates a senior premiership! It has been a long time between drinks. Yes, our A-2 boys brought home the bacon. It was a gallant win; they had a battle for the end of the season traveling to Eden Valley and Cambrai twice.

The Grand Final itself was not without a splash of drama when the second day (Sunday) was washed out without a ball being bowled despite the Eden Valley boys trying their best to 'con' the umpires into playing! As it turned out the cricketing 'Gods' gave us a perfect day the following Saturday when Duane Ireland and his boys systematically carved up Eden Valley to win by 48 runs. A great team effort and I am sure I speak for the whole club in saying congratulations for a fantastic effort!

The A-grade finished the season off in grand style winning the Courier Cup and comprehensively beating the Lobethal Gold team to finish the season on top of the premiership table. Craig Medlow, with the assistance of Matt Laming in particular, played a great captain's knock to steer us to victory in the 1st semi. As disastrous batting collapse in the Grand Final saw the boys capitulate to a meagre 65 runs which Lobethal easily made for the loss of only 2 wickets.

Our two B Grade teams were competitive all season, each team winning one of the two local "Derbies". In the end Downsie's B Red defeated Eden Valley the Premiers from last season in the final game but fell 2 points short of a finals berth. Heath's B Blue team were only 7 points away from also competing in finals.

At this point I would like to say a big thanks to Mr. Mick Weatherall for all the hard work he put in on a Thursday night at training and Saturday afternoons at the game. The feedback I got from the boys was always very positive and with Mick being the State U15 coach it goes without saying his coaching is of the highest standard.

With regards to the Juniors the only team to feature was the U-14 Red team coached by Stevey Downs. They played Lobethal in the final but were unlucky to lose on the last ball of the day.

Once again, we had a good representation of our juniors in the Association. Seven lads were in the U16 Association side and there were three in the U12 Fleurieu North side. Of the trophy winners Sam Herde won the U14 bowling with Jayden Hill runner up and Jacob Grieger won the U16 bowling trophy.

Whilst on the juniors a big, big acknowledgement and thank you to Tash and Anthony Hortle and Rick and Michelle Hill for their tireless efforts with the juniors.

This year saw the club house get a major makeover. A reverse-cycle air conditioner was installed on the eastern wall; the floor was re-stumped and a new timber floor was laid by our resident carpenter, James Marshall. New tables and chairs were also purchased and we extend our thanks to Col Hackett from Lobethal who assisted in getting us a good price. When tidy the old clubrooms now look very attractive. It is our intention to pass on plans for more improvements behind the bar

to the incoming committee for their action so that continued improvements will be maintained. I would also like to thank Mark Rooney for his contribution with the welder in modifying a large table.

A Grade Captains Report 2011

This Season the A Grade built on the previous season and played the most consistent cricket for a long time, winning 8 games straight before losing the grand final. People might look at the results and say that the A Grade has yet made another final and lost, but I believe that we have demonstrated as a team that we can play very good cricket and have now built a game plan that we can play with confidence and know it will make us successful in the future. The hardest thing to swallow as the captain was the first time we didn't play to this plan was the most important day, the grand final.

Jeremy Snoad

Jeremy was a great acquisition for the club this season. He filled the trouble spot of opening with great poise getting us off to a good start on many occasions. In the field was very handy, especially when he didn't field the ball with his knee. I believe Jeremy will come back next season even stronger and will be an important player going forward to fulfil our potential.

Matt Johnston

Half way through the season after Matt had got over his injury found that the side needed him to open the batting. Matt took on this responsibility without any fuss like a true vice-captain of the side. Matt showed that he will be very important in this position over the coming seasons with some fine performance, notably against Mount Torrens where he batted for nearly two hours and then in the semi-final where he again batted for nearly 30 overs. Both games set us up for a convincing win. With the ball, when the skipper gave him an opportunity he bowled very well and was a great support to me as my vice captain for the season.

Dave Wescombe

Wingers had a stand out season. Making 4 50's (also 400+ runs for the season), and then taking the most wickets for the team with over 25 wickets. When Wingers was in full flight with the bat nothing could stop him. The innings against Uraidla in the semi-final of the Courier Cup was an example of this when he made 93. With the ball we could always rely on him coming on and drying up the runs, while also taking wickets consistently. He took his first 6 wicket haul in A grade in the last minor round game of the season against Lobethal Gold. Once again in the field he was exceptional.

Nick Johns

What a return by Slim in his first season back. To take the number 4 position and then make over 500 runs at an average of nearly 50 is outstanding. Some notably innings weren't the Nick of old where he would blast his runs. These were in the Courier Cup Final where he made a very patient 32 runs to get us over the line and in the semi-final when he made 32 runs and had a very vital partnership with Matt Johnston to stem the tide. What a gun recruit by James Marshall. Jarrad after being away from the club for a few years came back in the side as a great asset for the team. Then his determination in the final where he made a patient 19 off over 80 balls was a great example of his determination and courage. His presence around the team and on the field was excellent. I am looking forward to seeing Jarrad launch his A Grade career off the back of this fine season.

James Marshall

James struggled this season with the bat after a promising season last year. James had an interrupted year, missing a few Saturdays which meant he struggled to find consistent form with the bat. His highlight was when he opened the batting with Jeremy Snoad against Paracombe where they put on 68 for the first wicket. James fielding was outstanding where he took 9 catches throughout the season. Hopefully James bounces back from this season and show the consistency he showed in 2009/10.

Matt Laming

Matt Laming was around more often than not compared to his first season back at the club. His passion to succeed in all areas of the game came through on numerous occasions. With the bat he topped scored with 45 against Mount Torrens working hard with the lower order (putting on 83 for the last 4 wickets). He also showed this again in the Semi Final having a 73 partnership with me at a vital stage of the game. With the ball naturally was unlucky and bowled better than the wickets column showed. His spell in the Courier Cup Final set the game up with his 3 early wickets and was unlucky not to win the man of the match (with 3 catches and a few runs). I look forward to next season where Matt will come back to the club to take his 200th wicket for the club (currently sitting on 199)

Craig Smith

Craig showed this season what he is capable with the ball. Early in the season he took two 5 wicket hauls against the Lobethal sides. He then continued this form into the Association games taking numerous wickets and was very unlucky not to win the player of the Meyer shield for Torrens Valley. With the batting showed glimpses of what he is capable of and hopefully next season will take the giant strides he has with his bowling in the batting and become a true all-rounder for the side. In the field as long as his fingers were pointing up he always had very safe hands.

Chris Baschiera

Chris had an excellent season. In the fielding he won the association fielding trophy which shows how consistent his fielding was. With the bat he went for 6 innings without

getting out, which is what you need for your lower order batsmen. In the bowling always bowled a consistent line and length and numerous times was unlucky not to take more wickets (but the batters weren't good enough to get the edge). His economic rate with the ball of 1.8 and bowling average of 9.8 was evidence of how good his bowling was this season.

Michael Klose

Michael literally followed his father footsteps, achieving a milestone that his father achieved numerous times for our A grade sides of the past. He was able to take more wickets (23) than scoring runs (12). If you ask Michael there were numerous times (3) where he was left stranded at the crease and he was certain to make many runs in those games. Michael had a great season taking over 23 wickets at an average of a tick over 12. His extreme slow pace and flight caught many players off guard and worked in tandem with Craig Smith very well. Look forward to many seasons watching Michael frustrate players as Michael's bowling style will allow him to bowl many seasons as long as the wind doesn't get in his eyes (A grade joke!).

- Christian Riebeling; Who played his first A grade game (with his cousin), and taking his first A grade wicket in this game
- Roy Harrison; Who played his first A grade game for a number of years. Looking forward to having him around the club next season
- Tim Johns; Cameo performance in our outright, making a solid 9 not out

Well we did it!

The first senior premiership in 10 years!...and wait for itwith a side with an average age of 40, thanks Heno, Dutch, Christian & Matty for pulling that average down a bit. GRANT PARKER 114 Runs 7 Catches 2 Run Outs

A fighting 16 to help stop the rot at Cambrai was followed by a fantastic 65 in the Grand Final, coming to the wicket after about 10- overs with the score at 3/15 it was important that Peter still be in at Tea, which he did achieve and then his innings blossomed which kicked our score from an average one of 140 to 150 up to 193 which proved to be a winning score.
