Unfortunately, our effort in the semi-final was not up to our best and we were beaten by a better Nairne team on the day.

1. Tyson Reichstein



This was Tyson's first full season of A2 cricket and after his finish to the 2016/17 season, I was looking for a consistent effort from him at the top of the order. When he did produce with the bat at the top of the order, the side was generally successful. With 193 runs before Christmas, having played a few games in the A-grade, finishing with 264 for the season was a disappointing finish. If Tyson can apply himself mentally, he is capable of big scores and a big season tally. Handy fielder, who generally has a good

pair of hands. Handy fill in wicket keeper. Rates himself as a bowler but haven't seen him back this up with any actions yet.

2.Will Dunstall



Will spent most of his season in the B-grade racking up runs with Moorey at the top of the order. My youth policy worked against him throughout the season but when he was given the opportunity to open the innings in the A2's at the end of the season, he took it and was a big part of the improvement to our results at the end of the season. Very compact batsman, who is able to bat for long periods of time. This is something the A2's lacked at times. Very handy fielder, who provides voice in the field and always gives 100%.

3. James Bradley



James is still a very technically correct batsman and this season he was more consistent in the way he batted and the scores he accumulated. Needs to stop trying to score by hitting across the line of the ball unless it is chest height. Rotating the strike is another area to improve. James is one of the batsmen in our side who is able to bat for long periods, this is an essential in a team of stroke makers. James has continued to improve in the field this season and has taken some good catches.

4. Steve Hahesy

Steve has had a poor season by his own standards. Tried to allow the younger brigade to take on more responsibility in the early part of the season and batted lower in the order. While he made some handy scores throughout the season, struggled to have the impact he has had in the past. After a season without bowling, due to a shoulder injury, he was able to contribute with the ball again this season and his lack of pace entices the batsmen to play shots.

5. Harry Ronan

Harry started the season in the B's and then made his place in the 2's as the number one keeper. He worked hard behind the stumps and threw himself into his work. Whether keeping up at the stumps or back, he was consistent in his glove work and took a number of catches and a few stumpings. The area of most improvement was his batting. After starting back in the 2's with scores of 0, 0, 4, 12, 0, 2 and 8, he was a handy contributor with scores of 33, 11 and 29 in the last three rounds of the season and showed what he is capable of with the bat when he bats to his strengths. Sadly, Harry will be

moving away due to work and moving house. I wish him all the best at his new club next season.



6. Craig Medlow

Craig was a welcome addition to the side after missing a few early games. He is an experienced cricketer and showed his worth on a number of occasions with both bat and ball. His bowling in the semi-final was a stand out when the rest of the side were being hit around. When buckets gets it right with the ball, batsmen struggle to score against him. His batting didn't have the impact on games that it could have this season, but still made many handy contributions when we needed him to.



7. Mitchell Crisp

Crispy started the season with the A2's and then disappeared overseas where we thought he was going to be staying for the remainder of the season. Then out of the blue, he returned to Australia and the A2 team with about 4 games left in the minor round. He was a very welcome addition with his medium pace bowling and his solid batting in the lower order. Helped get us over the line against Maccy and Nairne in the last couple of rounds.







8. Jeremy Druwitt

Jez is another, who played his first full season of A2 cricket and also had a game in the A's as well. He is an exceptional fielder whether in the inner circle or on the boundary. He has a safe pair of hands when the ball is in the air and has the best arm in the side. His bowling is very damaging when he gets it right but needs to work on his consistency in this area. The area where he has improved most this season has been his batting. His efforts to

bat us to wins against Nairne and Macclesfield in final over run chases was excellent to see. Has a lot of ability with the bat when he sets his mind to it and bats within himself.

9. Brayden Coulthard

Brayden started the season in the A's due to his useful medium fast swing bowling. He then returned to the A2's where his bowling was a little inconsistent. There were days when he was unhittable and others where he struggled to hit the pitch. This is an area where he needs to improve. 



Congratulations to all the trophy winners for the season and I hope to see you all again in the 2017/18 season.


